Poetry is put in 811 (American), 819.1 (Canadian), 821

(British)

J Fewer pictures

Written for grades 4-6

Protagonists younger than 13

Shorter in length than YA and larger print and more white space Some older level content picture books like Asterix, Tintin, graphic novels

Y Reading level grades 7-9

Protagonists are teenagers

Fewer or no pictures,

Smaller print

More mature or controversial subjects like sex, rites of passage which comment directly on growth to adolescence as a process High school or junior high setting

F Adult fiction

Protagonists are adults or older teens

Usually no pictures

Small print

Mature subjects

Work or home setting

813.54, 819.3, 823 - Do not use. These are fiction books so use the above categories.

Nonfiction – Limit the number to four places after the decimal point or less. Go by abridged Dewey.
