5. Business Arising from the Minutes

5.1 COVID-19 Developments and Responses

Graham Guest, our archivist, is still working from home but is gradually transitioning back to the workplace. We have been using an app call ed Slack, an in-house messaging system, that has been working very well.

5.2 Sector and Strategic Planning

5.2.1 Provincial Public Library Sector Plan, Year One Update / Directors & PLLO Meeting June 6

The Provincial Budget came down and we received a zero percent increase in our funding, which in effect decreased our purchasing power by about 6%, which is the interest rate currently.

The Provincial Sector Planning is coming to the end of its first year, with not much change.

Next year's budget is in the planning stage right now, and we are hoping that libraries will be on the table for discussion and increases.

5.2.2 PNLS Strategic Planning (Tentatively 2022)

We are trying to come up with a date to do our strategic plan before the end of 2022, however the date of the Northern Libraries Conference will not work, since the majority of the board will be attending the NATA provincial meetings.

5.3 PNLS 2022 Annual General Meeting (AGM) Wrap-Up

Once we were able to get the internet working, the AGM went very smoothly. The Annual Report has been sent to Jack Ma at Provincial Library.

6. Finance

6.1 Financial Statements Update

James went through the Profit & Loss Statement, and the Balance Sheet up to June 11, 2022. To date, we have received two allotments of our provincial grant. There will be a third allotment sometime in June, and the balance will be sent to us some time around October.

6.2 Headquarters Building and Infrastructure Updates 6.2.1 HQ Entryway Area Resurfacing Planning

We had initially been looking at installing rubberized asphalt at the front entrance to cover the cracks in the concrete slabs, and to make it wheelchair accessible. However, it came down too late in the year to have that done. The new quote that we received for this year increased from \$6,300 to \$7400 for product and labour, and the warranty decreased from 7 years to 5 years. There are a number of businesses in town that has this product installed, most notably, the front entrance to the post office. It has started to come apart in large chunks.

With that in mind, we will be looking for some other product that we can installed.

6.2.2 Building Security System Upgrade Planning & Motion

Over the last year, there have been several murders in the vicinity of the library. The police had asked to check the security cameras for any information, however James found that only two of the cameras are working, and it is not recording. The system is over ten years old. He received a quote of about \$2,500 to upgrade and install new cameras.

So, Linda checked out the Conexus Mastercard, and we will get
this instead. They need two signatures and a motion for this to
take place.

6.5 Conexus Internet Purchases Fund Conversion (Harold Johnson Fund) Discussion & Motion

Lawyer and Author Harold Johnson passed away in February of this year. PNLS was approached by Alex Robertson Public Library and asked if we would consent to have a regional grant that is being set up in Mr. Johnson's name run through our library.

We do this regularly for our Member Library Grants, and other program grants.

Alex Robertson receives about \$240,000 per year in grants and funding and they are concerned that if this fund went through their library, they would be pushed past the threshold of \$250,000 revenues, in which case they would be required to have a full audit, costing upwards of \$20,000, which they cannot afford. Currently, revenues between \$50,000 and \$250,000 is not required to have that level of auditing, which is they are at present.

Currently, PNLS has an Internet Purchases bank account, which has not been used in many years. This account still has about \$3400 still in the account.

We are asking that this money be transferred to the Operations Account, and any money we receive for the Harold Johnson Fund can be run through there. It will be easier to track for reporting purposes.

7.1 Headquarters Staffing, Recruitment and Contract Updates 7.1.1 Headquarters Staff Work-From-Home

Using email, Slack, phone, zoom and other technologies, it has been working very well.

7.1.2 Office Assistant Position Update

Our permanent Office Assistant informed that she would not be coming back from her maternity leave, so Kim's contract has been extended to the then of August. She is finishing up her Master's in Education, and depending on whether she finds a teaching position, we can extend her contract.

7.1.3 Processor Position Update

Our processor returned from her winter break and resumed her duties. We are purchasing books and supplies on an on-going basis, rather doing a year-end blitz. It is easier to keep up with processing the materials by doing this.

7.1.4 Job Description Updates Ongoing

James is still looking at several new positions and with that, new job descriptions. We do not necessarily need to hire for all at once, but by having guidelines in place, it will be easier to determine the job that needs to be filled. We have issues recruiting for the north, resulting in James and Harriet doing multiple jobs.

8.4 SUMA Convention 2022, April 3 – 6, Regina

James attended the SUMA convention this year and there was a resolution regarding library funding brought forward. We are hoping that there will be some discussion at the Treasury Board level for increased funding for the libraries. Larger centres, such as Saskatoon and Regina, receive the majority of their funding through the cities mill rate, however most other regional libraries receive their funding through the government. The Provincial Budget Planning will be starting soon and we are hoping that they will take a closer look at what we do and give us greater funding to continue our work.

8.5 **2022 SLA Conference, May 4 – 6, Regina**

James attended this SLA Conference and was the emcee again this year. Harriet attended the seminar "Governance in the Non-Profit World". We will look at using this to do some board training. The information should be on the SLA website.
