## GALE HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Free school access to the **Gale Health and Wellness Database** has been provided by the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education. It is a valuable resource for secondary students and teachers. It offers a wide range of information related to physical and mental health. Here are some uses and ways it can be utilized:

- 1. **Research**: High school students can use the database to find **reliable information** for health-related research projects, including topics like mental health disorders, treatments, and prevention strategies.
- 2. **Health Education:** Teachers can access articles, videos, and images to enhance health education lessons, covering subjects such as nutrition, exercise, and stress management.
- 3. **Mental Health Awareness:** In observance of World Mental Health Day, students can explore articles on mental health awareness, the importance of seeking help, and strategies for promoting mental wellbeing.
- 4. **Homework Support:** Students can use the database to find answers to health-related homework questions and to cite authoritative sources for assignments.
- 5. **Current Events:** Stay up-to-date with the latest health news and research findings, especially those related to mental health, which can be relevant for classroom discussions.
- 6. **Health Projects:** Students can use the database to gather data and insights for health-related projects, presentations, and awareness campaigns.
- 7. **Toolbars:** Gale's handy toolbars appear above each article, allowing users to translate articles into different languages, enlarge text, listen to text, change page colour and font type for dyslexia and other reading and language processing disorders, share, print, and cite.

"Coraline" is a captivating and eerie young adult fantasy novel written by Neil Gaiman. The story revolves around a curious and adventurous girl named Coraline Jones, who discovers a hidden doorway in her new home that leads to a parallel world inhabited by seemingly idealized versions of her parents. However, she soon realizes that this "Other" world holds dark secrets, and she must summon her courage to confront a malevolent entity known as the Other Mother. Gaiman skillfully weaves themes of bravery, individuality, and the importance of family throughout the narrative, making it an engaging choice for classroom discussion. Additionally, the book's blend of whimsical and unsettling elements can spark conversations about imagination, the unknown, and the power of storytelling in shaping our perceptions of reality, making it an excellent choice for exploring literary analysis and critical thinking with students.
