

chairperson's Report

2023 was a year of productive revitalization for the Pahkisimon Nuye?áh Library System, which continued its restoration of pre-pandemic services and functions, established new strategic direction, and welcomed new staff and new partnerships into the fold. Demand for library services remained strong across our northern region, as our numbers for item checkouts and total circulations increased in 2023 over the numbers from 2022, which had shown major increases from our numbers in 2021. Our website usage also increased from 2022 to 2023 in both session counts and pageview counts.

The year began with the 2023 Northern Reading Program, its final year under longtime program administrator Harriet Roy, as it ran through the months of January and February and crowned La Loche as the "Readingest Community" winner for the year. Congratulations to La Loche on winning the NRP Reading Challenge, and of course congratulations to Harriet Roy on her retirement; her incredible career was celebrated by the Saskatchewan Library Association, who recognized Harriet with their 2023 Frances Morrison Award for outstanding service to libraries, and by Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan Russ Mirasty, who presented her with the 2023 Saskatchewan Literary Award of Merit for Professional Leadership in Literacy.

PNLS entered its second year of participation in the Regional Park Pass Lending Program—a collaboration with the Saskatchewan Library Association, Saskatchewan Regional Parks Association, and Saskatchewan Parks & Recreation Association—and also entered its first year of partnership with the North Saskatchewan River Basin Council and its Notice Nature outdoor program. As part of its ongoing fundraising for the Northern Saskatchewan Archives, PNLS staff also set up a mobile book sale at the Napatak Ramble Music and Arts Festival for the first time, including a TD Summer Reading Club StoryWalk™ around the festival grounds.

With the arrival of new PNLS Teacher-Librarian Roseanne Dery, who joined the organization to a warm welcome in May of this past year, PNLS debuted a new monthly newsletter for libraries and schools in 2023, PNLS Pages, available both by email subscription and through the PNLS website. Roseanne also created and introduced an all-new, year-round Northern Library Planner, making both print copies and digital copies available to all library staff across northern Saskatchewan. We are thrilled to have Roseanne as part of the PNLS team and look forward to more excellent work to come.

The PNLS Northern Library Conference was able to return to an in-person format in October of 2023, for the first time since 2019, and was a resounding success that brought library staff from all across northern Saskatchewan together for professional development and exciting learning opportunities. The PNLS board and staff were also able to meet during that time for our long-awaited strategic planning session, facilitated by the Provincial Library and Literacy Office, which has now led to the establishment of the 2024–2027 PNLS Strategic Plan.

The PNLS Headquarters staff are a special crew of hardworking and talented people, and everyone in the north benefits from their tireless efforts throughout the year. I want to extend special congratulations to Lisa Ulriksen, who became Assistant Director of the organization following Harriet Roy's retirement.

This is the final year of my term on the PNLS Board of Trustees, and as outgoing Chairperson I want to thank all of our board members for their contributions to our system and for their dedication to strengthening services for northerners. I have learned a great deal in my time as the Chairperson of PNLS, and I know that everyone on our board and staff will continue the organization's fantastic work in the years to come. As always, *The Pahkisimon Nuye?áh Library System will lead the North to information*.
