# **Curriculum Integration:**

Borrowing books that are relevant to the topics being taught can enhance the learning experience and support curriculum's goals.



## **Encouraging Independent**

Reading: Borrowing a block of books can give students access to a wider selection of reading materials to choose from.



# **Special Projects or Units:**

Special projects or units of study that require a collection of books related to a specific theme or topic.



Research and Reference: You may need books for your own research or professional development. Subject requests allows you to access a wide range of resources without having to search for titles on your own and borrow one-byone - we do all the work for you!

Using On The Trapline by David A. Robertson in the classroom is a powerful way to observe the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation. This poignant picture book offers a meaningful opportunity to explore cultural heritage, Indigenous knowledge, and the intergenerational connections central to understanding Indigenous experiences. Through the story of a young boy and his grandfather revisiting a traditional trapline, students can engage with themes of memory, identity, and respect for the land, while also reflecting on the impact of residential schools and the importance of reconciliation.

Goodbye Buffalo Bay by Larry Loyie is a must-have for middle and high school curricula, especially for educators teaching about Canada's history and the impact of residential schools. This short novel vividly portrays a young Cree man's journey to reclaim his cultural identity after residential school. Ideal for grades 7 to 12, it encourages critical thinking, empathy, and discussions on reconciliation and cultural resilience. Students will enjoy the relatable characters and engaging storytelling while gaining a deeper understanding of Indigenous history and the importance of cultural preservation.
