
October 2024 Highlights



This Place: 150 Years Retold is a visually striking graphic novel anthology that re-examines 150 years of Canadian history from Indigenous perspectives. Through ten powerful short stories, Indigenous authors and artists explore themes of colonization, resilience, and identity, providing a narrative that challenges conventional histories and highlights the lived experiences of Indigenous peoples in Canada.

This book is an excellent resource for integrating Indigenous perspectives across the Saskatchewan curriculum. It can be used in various subjects:

- Social Studies/History: To deepen students'
 understanding of treaties, Indigenous governance,
 colonization, and the impact on Indigenous communities.
- English Language Arts: For analyzing narrative techniques, storytelling from diverse perspectives, and exploring graphic novels as a form of literature.
- Arts Education: To explore visual storytelling, Indigenous art styles, and the cultural significance behind the illustrations.

This Place is appropriate for grades 7-12, making it a versatile tool for middle and high school classrooms. A teacher resource guide is available to assist with lesson planning and integrating the book into the curriculum. This guide can be borrowed from the library.
