
Here's what's happening:

Did you know...


PNLS has partnered up with the Northern Sport, Culture & Recreation District and we now loan out winter sports equipment.

Celebrate the spirit of the Canadian Sled Dog Challenge this February with Miriam Körner's Yellow Dog—a middle-grade novel set in Northern Saskatchewan that weaves together themes of survival, resilience, and the bond between humans and sled dogs. Winner of the 2018 Snow Willow Award, Yellow Dog is perfect for sparking discussions about wilderness, teamwork, and overcoming personal challenges.

Cross-curricular connections

- Language Arts: Explore themes of resilience, teamwork, and self-discovery. Analyze how Miriam Körner uses setting and character to create vivid storytelling.
- Social Studies: Investigate the cultural and historical significance of dog sledding and its role in northern communities.
- **Science:** Study sled dogs' physical adaptations, training, and nutrition, as well as strategies for wilderness survival in harsh climates.
- Northern Lifestyles: Connect the novel to real-life practices in the North, like dog sledding and winter survival skills.
