

## Companion Read: Alone & Hatchet Two Survival Stories, Two Different Challenges

For years, Hatchet by Gary Paulsen has captivated readers with its gripping survival story and themes of resilience, self-reliance, and personal growth. Now, **Alone** by Megan E. Freeman offers a fresh take—where the greatest challenge isn't the wilderness but **complete isolation in an abandoned town.** 

At **410 pages**, Alone may seem like a big read, but its **novel-in-verse** format makes it **fast-paced**, **accessible**, **and engaging**, **even for reluctant readers**. Maddie, a 12-year-old girl, wakes up to find that an emergency evacuation has left her behind. Her **parents assume she's with the other**, and with no way to contact them, she must **scavenge supplies**, **ration food**, **and survive alone for years**—her only companion, a Rottweiler named George.

Like Hatchet, Alone explores themes of independence, problem-solving, and perseverance, but through a modern lens—with Maddie navigating a world of abandoned homes, disconnected technology, and uncertainty. This gripping survival story is an ideal companion read for Hatchet, offering students the opportunity to compare two vastly different survival experiences —one against nature, the other against solitude.

As a novel in verse, Alone is also a perfect way to celebrate National Poetry Month. Need unit plan ideas? Email me!
